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3. President's Report

The Club has enjoyed another busy and successful year through all aspects of its operations. The main focus/vision this year has been the importance of enhancing opportunities for participation in Gymsports. One physical manifestation of this goal has been the start of building works, which will increase the enjoyment and safety of the Club's established and developing programs.

The Club has also welcomed opportunities to participate in Community events: Belconnen Community Festival, ACT Playgroups days, as well as to host visitors for Gymnastics Experience classes: Southern Highland schools; local preschools visits and neighbouring child-care centres.

Of course, these activities would not be possible without the enthusiasm of the organising and participating coaches.

Gymnastic Results, Retirements

Again, Club gymnasts have enjoyed excellent outcomes in both ACT, interstate and National competitions. All event results are attached. Notable is Canberra City's second placed Overall club in Level 7 to 10 at National Clubs, Caloundra ... a historic event.

Our State Levels' gymnasts (MAG and WAG) participated joyfully in all ACT competitions including the final grading days, with many achieving blue and gold ribbons at levels 1 to 4, while in levels 5 to 10, Canberra City gymnasts regularly placed in the top three.

CCGC boys entered Reach for the Stars, ACT MAG State Titles and MAG National Clubs for the second time (in history?) and achieved some personal best results. The Committee was also pleased to have the boy's kitted out in official uniform.

From 2007, the MAG program will undergo a change from State & National groups to MAG Squad 1 and MAG Squad 2. Also, coaches are planning travel to competitions further afield for MAG teams.

Lauren Donne retired after competing Level 10 successfully at last year's Reach for the Stars. Lauren, a gymnast with the Club for around 10 years, and family were great supporters of Canberra City and past Committee members. The Club congratulates Lauren on her achievements in gymnastics.

Staff

The Club is indeed fortunate to have enthusiastic staff at all levels.

Mandy Barras, who joined the Club early this year and is our Head Coach at RAGE campus in Gungahlin and Club MAG coordinator;

Lyndell Burden - junior cheerleading coach, newly accredited;

Alison Finlayson, who also joined the Club early this year and is a newly accredited coach.

We bid farewell and thank you to:

Anthea Hewett, long-serving gymnast and coach, who departed early this year to commence study at Sydney University;

Kimiko Holder, gymnast and long-serving coach, who left in the middle of the year to travel around Australia and 'settle' in Perth;

Amber Ashley, coach and choreographer, who has returned home to Sydney;

I would also like to thank Helen Preston for her wonderful contribution in the office during the last ~4 years (if not the previous umpteen years as a parent member). Helen has advised she is retiring at the end of this year.

The Committee has continued its policy to support personal and professional development for all staff by subsidising course fees and travel as well as holding regular in-Club workshops.

Membership & Advertising. External Programs. New Programs.

Membership numbers 2006 are 920 and have surpassed our previous high of many years ago (and from around 650 in 2003). These enrolments are for the whole year and include children participating in our Schools program.

However, contributing to this membership figure is arguably the Kindergym / day time program. Congratulations to KG Coordinator Naomi Nye and the team for the exciting and topical themes presented each term and also the progression classes.

The enrolment form survey indicates that word-of-mouth is how most members learn of the Club. The website also provides an insight to the Club and is often mentioned.

We continue to provide a presence at community events and now have a couple of DVDs we can run on a loop to display the range of programs at the Club. We hope to build a mini library of such DVDs. We have also successfully introduced the come-and-try-it voucher, which we have handed out at community displays.

External Programs

Canberra City, as a parent organisation, has tried to maintain participation levels at the various venues (TEAM, RAGE, Majura and Miles Franklin). The Committee hopes to increase participation levels in North Canberra by 'advertising' in the Gungahlin Newsletter - Gunsmoke. Many thanks to committee members and coaches at the satellite programs.

New Programs

Cheerleading, adult and junior (Mayhem and HiJinx respectively) are fully under the CCGC umbrella. HiJinx started during term 2 and currently trains at Cook primary. We look forward to the squad making use of our new facilities. Mayhem is very visible two or more evenings at the Club and the attached report is an indication of the squad's enthusiasm. For a beginning group they have achieved great results at a national level.

Our commitment to disability sports will see classes starting in 2007 under coach Mary Schumacher's wing. We have also partnered with Special Olympics ACT Region and are well on track with planning a 'come-n-try' day, 24th January 2007. It is noteworthy that Gymnastics Australia is now promoting 'Project Connect' and 'Special O' and that Canberra City is leading the way locally.

Schools Program

This area of the Club's continues to be a major contributor, not only to youngsters' participation, but also to the Club's financial well-being. We have three schools where Club coach Geoff Monro, provides gymnastic tuition to **all** classes: St Mathews in Page, Charnwood Primary and, more recently, Qeanbeyan

primary. Again, many thanks must go to all the coaches who run classes at Aranda primary and Cook primary. Running school classes is a difficult art.

Education

We view this as a most important area of Club activity.

The Club continues to hold technical and information workshops every term and encourages/supports staff to update annually by attending local and NSW Coaching Congresses every year. Club members have again assisted the ACT in holding judges and coaches courses. It is pleasing to note the number of CCGC new coach accreditations applied for this year as well as the level of CCGC judge accreditations awarded: two National 1 and one National 2 WAG judge and one Level 2 MAG judge.

Building, Infrastructure and Equipment.

The major work this year has been the commencement of building extensions Stages 4 & 5. Our organisation is indeed fortunate (considering 2006 ACT Budget constraints) to have succeeded with our partnerships and grant and bank loan applications, which took so much of our time during 2005. Thanks must go to members' contribution to ideas and plans.

We are all experiencing many inconveniences, particularly with reduced space in the carpark and, more recently, in the gym itself. We hope you are re-assured that it will all be worth-while in the not-too-distant future and we thank you for your patience.

The Committee is proud to have begun this milestone project, part of the Club's strategic plan, which we hope will improve the work and training environment for current and future members and programs, as well as ACT programs and competitions.

We also hope to provide space for other local community activities.

Office & Administration. Communication.

The Office administration work continues to increase with the Club's expanding programs and activities, including an increase in visiting groups and invitationals.

We continue to work towards a high level of quality assurance with our Club documentation and policies. At present we are slightly disorganised with our noticeboards and information dissemination due to the building works.

Canberra City's website <http://www.canberracity.org.au/>, continues to be a useful communication tool, particularly for expatriates around the world.

Volunteer Efforts. Grants. Awards.

Thanks to the volunteer effort of the Club's members, gymnasts, parents, coaches and judges, we again earned financial support (\$1700) for the Club's contribution to the hosting of the MAG National Clubs in July.

The Committee formally thanks the volunteer efforts of Donna Hopkinson for organising Rosters for both Gym Cleaning and the Saturday morning Sausage Sizzles, as well as all the wonderful parents that turned up. I urge all members to support their efforts.

The competition groups have also benefited from the huge chocolate drive organised to support WAG travel to National Clubs in Caloundra. Again, thank you to Rosetta Schimizzi and Donna Hopkinson.

Similar fundraising efforts are planned for MAG competition groups to support planned travel in 2007.

The Committee has acquitted two grants since the last AGM:

- A Chief Minister's 'Renewing Community Facilities' grant of \$26,000, which was utilised to upgrade change-rooms and kitchen facilities;
- A Sport and Recreation 'Development' grant to upgrade Office IT & printing facilities (totalling \$4000).

The Club's 2005 successful applications for a Capital Assistance Grant (\$100,000) and a Sports Loan Interest Subsidy Grant (SLISS - \$197,000 over 10 years) were announced last November. This enabled your Committee to proceed with bank loan and building contracts to action the completion of extension Stages 4 & 5.

Congratulations also to Mary Schumacher who was elected ACT WAG Coaching coordinator this year and who was a successful applicant for an Australian Sports Commission 'Women in Sport Leadership' grant.

In the near future the Committee plans to apply for:

- A Health & Welfare grant to support the fit-out of new areas;
- A Wests Affiliate grant to subsidise a new sound system (partly completed).

Finally, **congratulations** to the ACT Level 9 team including CCGC gymnasts Phillipa Dickens, Laura Peel & Elise Wright, having been named ClubsACT Sport Team for May.

A new Club award has been initiated as of last term: Coach-of-the-Term/Year. The Committee welcomes nominations for these awards, which come with a pleasant bonus.

Finance

The accounts provide an insight into the resource intensive nature of providing gym sports in a professional manner to our community. The Club is an incorporated not-for-profit association, however has a substantial turnover in monies.

Gymnast Scholarships This year Melissa Orr, WAG Level 7, received a term fees scholarship following her performance at Australian Championships, where she was also selected to represent Australia at the Levels International Challenge held in Perth in September. Als Emma Carroll, CCGC Level 6 gymnast earned a CCGC travel subsidy scholarship following her performance at National Clubs, Caloundra.

Staff Wages CCGC casual youth wages (and therefore on-costs such as now-9% superannuation, workers compensation, etc.) increased again in 2006.

Professional Development has been supported by reimbursement of accreditation costs following successful completion of coach courses by staff members. Also some support was provided to assist CCGC Judges accredit in the new Code of Points. A new initiative this year is the policy to utilise funds raised through CCGC's Xmas Cup Challenge, when all staff donate their time, to subsidise staff education costs.

Maintenance and Equipment Purchases are important ongoing aspects of current and future expense for Club safety and success. We have a Kindergym wishlist, which the Committee will action once space is allocatable. Regular Committee reports (posted on notice-boards and on the website) include details of ongoing repairs and purchases.

The Committee formally thanks Brian Hewett for his volunteer contribution to designing, building and repairing equipment as well as arranging all other maintenance works.

Maintenance also includes gym cleaning and the Committee plans to run a discussion/survey as to how we can best approach the increase in area to be cleaned and revamp the cleaning policy to be commensurate with commercial cleaning costs.

Referring to the financial statements.....

The Club has posted an operating surplus, which almost matches the Saturday BBQ fundraising donation. The Committee has appropriately spent funds for the benefit of current members.

Liabilities as at 30 June 2006 include leave provisions, CBA loan to June, as well as the usual July wages and on-costs. Please note that the CBA loan will peak at the approved \$445,000. Happily, the bank balance exceeds liabilities.

In conclusion.....

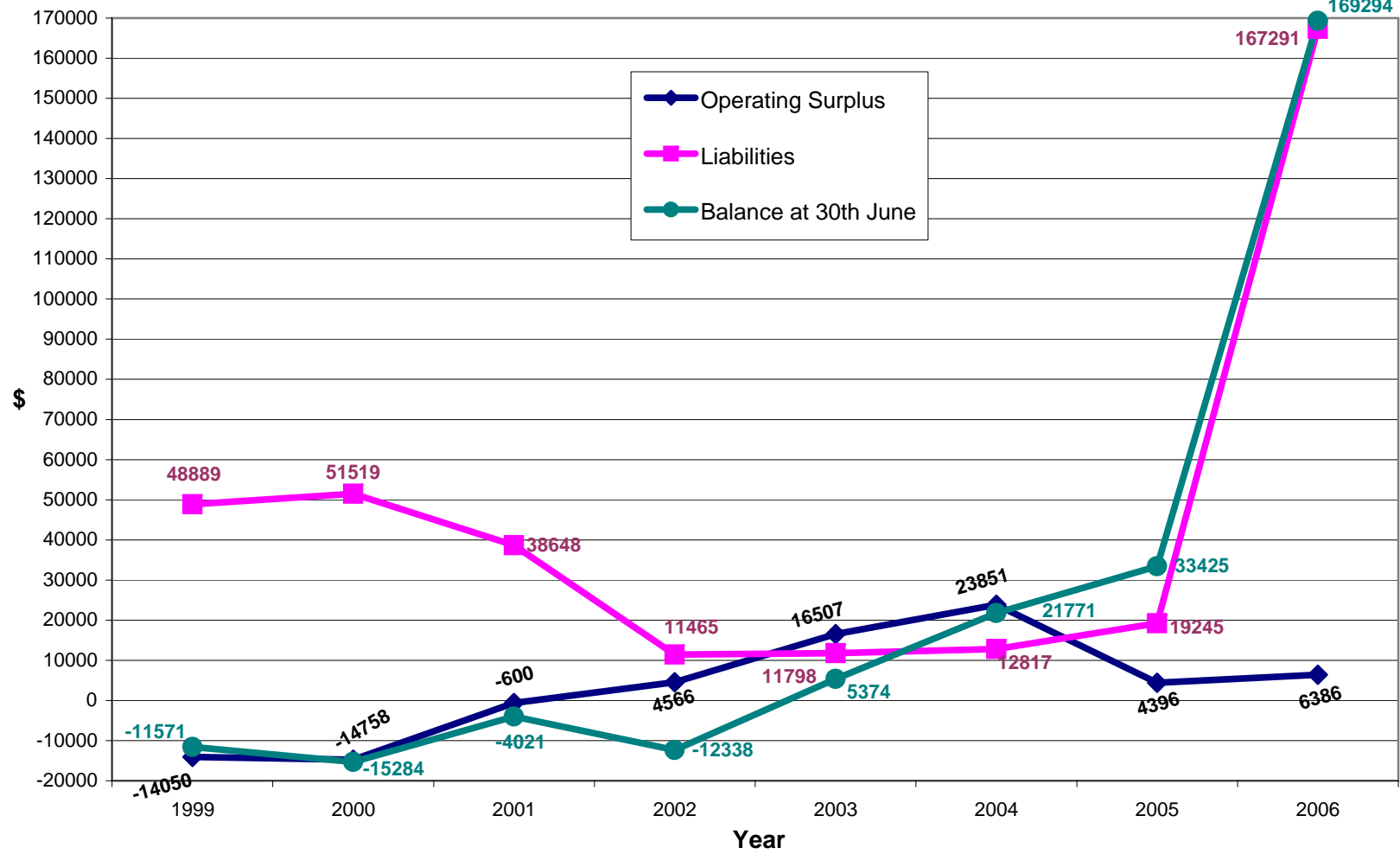
The Club has progressed across all aspects during this last year – thanks to the great support offered to the Committee by the staff, members and volunteers.

2006 REPORT

The sport of Competitive Cheerleading is fairly new and has yet to break through stereotypes of Sideline Cheerleading. Canberra City Mayhem Cheer Squad is at the forefront of Cheerleading in the ACT region and Canberra City Gymnastics Club, in its support, will also benefit from the promotion of the Squad.

The Squad was started in August 2005 and has since grown with membership at approximately 22 people. It was started as a social team that competed and has since been adopted by Canberra City Gymnastics as one of its Gymsport teams.

The Squad has already competed in two competitions, the first being the Down Under Spirit Championships at the Gold Coast, at which is placed 8th out of 9 teams in Open Stunt Division and 5th out of 8 teams in the Open Pom Division. The other competition was Nationals in Sydney at which the team placed 5th out of 8 teams in Open Stunt Division and 6th out of 7 teams in Open Pom Division. As well as Competition, the Squad has performed at numerous events around the ACT during this year including a fundraiser for the Blind Society and the Youth Showcase at Government House.

Unfortunately, there has been a high turnover rate of coaches in 2006 and it has been made clear that the administrative and finance systems need close attention as not much thought has been put into these. There has also been concern regarding the low and inconsistent attendance rate since the establishment of the Squad.

The 2006 season in all had many highlights and many achievements, but it also allowed us to look at how the Squad was being managed and how it could be improved upon. It became apparent that a more efficient and orderly way of training and managing the group was essential for its survival. Aside from this the Squad has bonded together quite well and our thirst for inspiration and knowledge about the sport is almost insatiable for some!

With the new 2007 season, it is hoped that a new fee and training structure will transform the team from a socially oriented, casual cheer squad to a squad with driven and committed athletes.

It is anticipated that an over haul of the current practices will begin in January 2007, with proper structured training schedules for competition and off seasons. In this regard, it is hoped that eventually we will establish a regular coaching team with full accreditation towards the end of the year. In late 2006, I established a group of Team Services Officers (TSOs) to help with Squad administration and promotion. This will be continued into the new year, with TSO's helping to promote the Squad by volunteering their time and various talents.

We would like to conduct a selection trial of sorts in February 2007, where attendance, skill and commitment are assessed for three weeks prior to an official selection trial for a panel of coaches. The Selection Panel will consist of the current Coach, Hi Jinx Coach, a guest coach from interstate and a CCGC Coach. From this we will choose which spots people will fill in the competition routine and whether we have a group of reserves.

Mayhem Cheer Squad aim to enter into the Down Under Spirit Championships in July 2007, the Regional (State of NSW) Competition around August 2007 and Nationals in October 2007. We will also continue to perform in events around the ACT such as The Multicultural Festival. We hope to eventually charge a performance fee that will go towards our fundraising money.

In terms of administration, we aim to produce a Cheer Handbook that would complement the CCGC Handbook. Team Policies, such as Team Spirit, Attendance and Transparency Policies, have already been created and it is hoped that a more comprehensive outline of team procedures and expectations will be included in the Handbook. A proper fee structure is something yet to be fully developed as this is dependant upon Squad numbers and the training calendar, but a 'term' fee for the last 10 weeks of 2006 has been implemented.

Gymnastics Australia is adopting the United State All Star Federation (USASF) rules and guidelines in 2007 so this will affect both our training and competition routines and will need to be investigated for training and coaching purposes as it will affect the level at which the Squad competes.

We also plan to design a new uniform and change colours to fall in line with the CCGC colour palette. This will be our first priority for fundraising in the new year. Designs for the new uniform will include a comfortable skirt and body

suit for females and a better cut pant for males. We hope to explore possible fundraising opportunities in January 2007 to cover or subsidise the cost of these uniforms.

It is both mine and the team's goal to mentor our younger students in the Hi Jinx Cheer Squad. We hope to promote the sport to them and gain a closer tie with the Junior Squad so as to represent a united CCGC Cheerleading Team at Competitions.

Ultimately, the aims of the Squad are to represent Canberra and the Club at a top level in both Regional and National Events and Competitions. We hope to bring the new sport to the attention of the ACT Sporting Community and establish it as a highly credible Gymsport.

We hope to work in close association with the Committee, Staff and Coaches of the Canberra City Gymnastics Club as your knowledge and support is of great use and worth to us.

In summary, there are many plans for the new year due to the many lessons we have learnt for the year past. We thank you for your support and hope for an even bigger and better 2007 season!

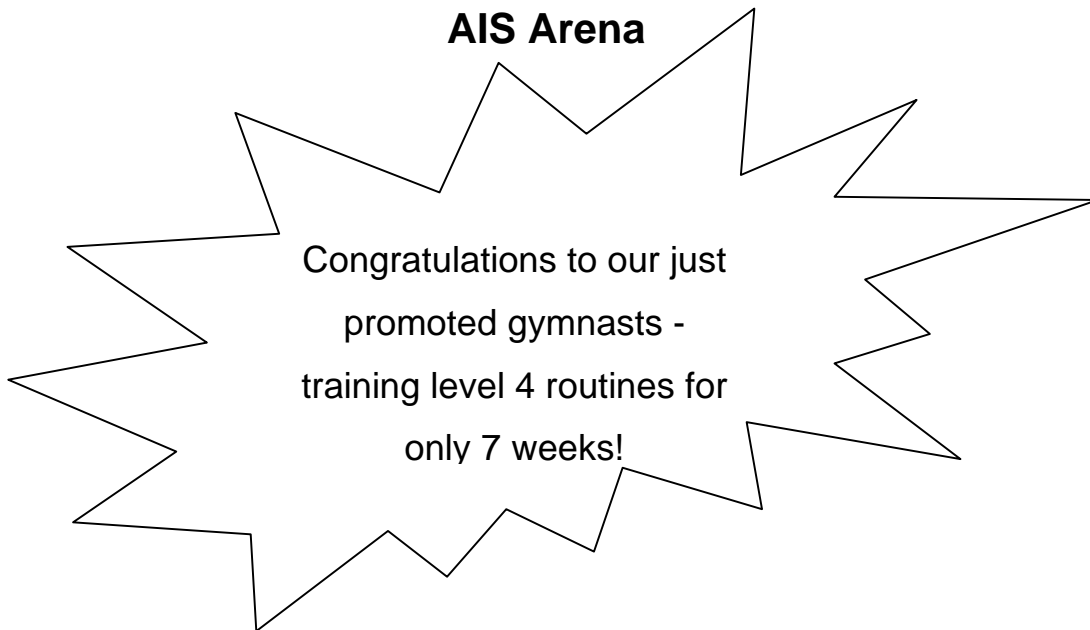
